The dissertation presents a new solution to the scientific problem concerning the comparative legal analysis of the administrative law of Ukraine and the EU member states (Greece, Bulgaria, Spain, Romania). A comparative characteristic of the subject of administrative law of Ukraine and the EU member states (Greece, Bulgaria, Spain, Romania) is carried out. As a result, the progressiveness of his understanding was discovered by Ukrainian scholars. After all, they directly determine that the first component of the subject of administrative law is the responsibility of the public administration in providing high quality and timely administrative services to individuals.

The peculiarities of administrative and legal status of public administration of Ukraine and Spain, Greece and Turkey are revealed. A comparative characteristic of the norms (sources) of administrative law of Ukraine and the EU member states (Greece, Bulgaria, Spain, Romania) is carried out. The common and distinctive features of the general understanding of the administrative law of Ukraine and Spain are revealed. The comparative and legal description of the tasks (functions) of the administrative law of Ukraine and Romania has been improved. It is revealed that the main difference between the principles of administrative law of Greece and Ukraine is that in Greece, the principle of integrity of the subjects of public administration has become firmly established.

It is proved that under the present conditions there are three bases for distributing the provisions of European administrative law and legal space of Ukraine to the domestic administrative law. Compliance by the European Public Administration and the National Public Administration with the provisions of the Association Agreement between Ukraine and the European Community. Compliance by national public administrations and the national public administration with certain EU regulations that directly concern Ukrainian citizens. Voluntary performance by the national public administration of certain administrative acts of the EU.
